re you interested in rafting on the Copper River, exploring the Copper River Delta, and meeting new peers from communities throughout the Copper River Watershed? Don't miss out on the 2015 Copper River Stewardship Program. We are looking for ten high school students from the region for this year's 11-day adventure. This year will include overnight rafting, canoeing and hiking adventures, and participants will help with habitat stewardship projects that benefit Dusky Canada geese and Chinook salmon. The overall goal of this program is to engage the future leaders of the region (you!) in an active exploration of your surroundings to learn about the history, ecology, and challenges facing the watershed and the wild salmon upon which you and your community depends.

- * The opportunity to canoe on the Copper River Delta, raft on the Copper River, and hike through the interior boreal forest and coastal temperate rainforest.
- * The chance to work with your peers from throughout the region on Dusky Canada goose and Chinook salmon habitat stewardship projects.
- JACK IS BACK! Yup'ik storyteller Jack Dalton will be back for another year of fun and creativity! He will work with participants to develop creative projects that share their experiences and lessons learned. Participants have the potential to get high school credit for successful completion of a project.
- * Participants will learn from and work with experts from a wide range of perspectives. This will not only teach you about a variety of potential careers in the region, but will help you to better understand the many, diverse perspectives that exist in the Copper River watershed.
