Are you interested in rafting on the Copper River, hiking on the Copper River Delta, and meeting new peers from communities throughout the Copper River watershed? Then don't miss out on the 2017 Copper River Stewardship Program. We are looking for ten high school students for this year's 10-day expedition.

Adventures planned include a multi-day overnight rafting trip, habitat stewardship projects that benefit fish and wildlife, and fun creative writing exercises to help you find your voice.

Our goal is to engage the future leaders of the region (you!) in an active exploration of your surroundings to learn about the history, ecology, and challenges facing the watershed and the wild salmon upon which you and your community depend.

Who is eligible? All current 8-12 graders from the region

Highlights for the 2017 trip include:

The opportunity to raft on the Copper River, hike through the interior boreal forest and coastal temperate rainforest, and participate in fun stewardship projects.

The chance to work with students from throughout the region as you learn and explore the Copper River watershed.

Participants will learn from and work with experts from a wide range of perspectives. This will not only teach you about a variety of potential careers in the region, but will help you to better understand the many, diverse perspectives that exist in the Copper River watershed.

- This program is intended for youth who are residents of, or have significant ties to, Alaska's Copper River Watershed, and/or the towns of Cordova or Valdez.
- Currently in 8th-12th grade.
- Willingness to participate in all trip requirements (orientation meeting, daily activities, journaling, final project etc.)
- Available from July 20-29th, 2017 and for an orientation, periodic follow up meetings, and presentations over the course of the following school year.
- Bring items listed on the suggested gear list. Loaner gear available upon request.
- Turn in signed liability, medical information, and other pre-trip forms upon request.
- Provide \$300.00 to help support the trip. **Scholarships are available.** If requesting a scholarship, please include a request with your application, with a paragraph explaining the circumstances.
- Be willing to follow safety guidelines as set forth by program organizers and guides.
- Be physically able to camp, hike and carry personal and group gear.
- Ability to work as a team with fellow participants.
- Complete a final project that will educate others about your experience on the trip and the Copper River watershed.
- Answer the required questions (on reverse side.)

- Please provide a letter of reference from an adult who knows you well but is not a relative. Provide answers to the following questions on separate paper in a clear and legible form. Answers will be judged on relevance, clarity, and completeness.

 - 2. What interests and/or skills do you have that you will use to capture/record your experiences, and for your follow-up project? Projects can be articles, presentations, artwork, videos, displays, etc.
 - 3. Please describe what you think makes a person a good team-player, and describe a time when you have been in a teamwork situation. Explain how you will be a team player if selected for the Copper River Stewardship Program.
 - 4. As you grow into and through your adult life, how will you continue to share the lessons and experiences you gained through participating in the 2017 CRSP?
