Summer Interpreter Job Announcement

The Ahtna Heritage Foundation in Partnership with the National Park Services is offering an opportunity for High School students between the ages of 15 to 18 to work at C'ek'aedi Hwnax Ahtna Cultural Center this summer. These positions are being funded through the Youth Partnership (YPP) program. The purpose of the YPP program is to introduce High School age students to the mission of the National Park Service and how the NPS manages our Cultural and Natural resources. This season's program will include a 2-week training period in which the students will travel to various areas within the park and possibly to other public lands for an orientation to the park and public lands. Other periodic fieldtrips into the park may occur after the training period.

This summer Ahtna Heritage Foundation will be hiring the following positions:

C'ek'aedi Hwnax Ahtna Cultural Center – (2 - positions) the students working at the C'ek'aedi Hwnax Ahtna Cultural Center will have knowledge of the Ahtna traditional way of life, to greet visitors to the Ahtna Cultural Center to stimulate appreciation of Ahtna cultural and history by conveying firsthand cultural knowledge to visitors. The student would provide interpretive information about the Ahtna history, culture and language. Assist with special events or projects, including meetings, cultural demonstrations, conference workshops and other duties.

How to Apply:

Any interested student between the ages of 15 and 18 (cannot turn 19 during the program) can obtain an YPP application at the C'ek'aedi Hwnax Ahtna Cultural Center or at the Alaska Job Center.

Application packages must be received by 4:30 p.m. at the C'ek'aedi Hwnax Ahtna Cultural Center or at Ahtna Heritage Foundation by Wednesday May 21st, 2014. An application package consists of the Youth Partnership Program application and a resume. The application process will consist of interviews and selection of two candidates.

This program will run for approximately 8-10 weeks beginning on or about June 2, 2014 and ending on or about August 8, 2014. The rate of pay is \$10.00 per hour. Applicants will be expected to work 40 hours per week.
