Purpose:

To award a one-time scholarship to qualifying students taking MINL 120 – Introduction to Mining Occupations & Operations (IMOO). The Center for Mine Training’s mission is to promote and inspire students to understand and appreciate the various aspects of a career in mining.

Application Process:

Applicant must submit the following items:

1. Completed application form (including school official AND parent/ guardian if under 18)
2. Registration Form for MINL 120.

Evaluation Process:

Applicants will be evaluated using the following criteria:

1. Thoroughness and thoughtfulness of answers to essay questions. (50%)
2. Attention to detail and completeness of the application. (25%)
3. Completed registration form. (25%)

Notes:

- Upon selection of scholarship awardees, an email will be sent to notify applicants of their status. Please make certain to provide an email address that is active and correct.
- Scholarship funds will be disbursed directly to UAS student accounts upon registration.
- Tours of one of the Juneau mines are included as part of class content, though completely optional. For students outside of Southeast Alaska, roundtrip travel between Juneau and the nearest community served by Alaska Airlines is provided to successful scholarship awardees.
