The following are student advisor expectations:

Pre-trip

- Participate in at least 4-5 planning meetings
- Develop educational themes
- Determine what sort of field trips and presentations will be scheduled during the trip
- Identify a specific project to lead during CRSP based on your skills and interest. Ideas include media coordination, raft trip assistance, specific field trip or activity, etc.
- Assist with menu planning and job assignments for participants

During Trip

- Lead 1-2 programs and/or projects determined prior to trip
- Model good expedition behavior
- Take the lead on group tasks (with adult input)
- Help mentor new participants when packing and preparing for field trips
- Coordinate group thank-yous at conclusion of the trip





Compensation:

- FREE participation on the 2016 CRSP (value of approximately \$1,500, save the \$300 program tuition for college!);
- The chance to plan the adventure! Where do you want to go and what do you want to do?
- At the conclusion of the expedition, student advisors will receive a letter of recommendation for inclusion in student portfolios and for submitting to college, scholarship, and job opportunities;
- An exlemplary leadership activity to include on resumes and applications.
